

Wood County Crime Stoppers offers cash rewards for information which leads to the arrest of a fugitive wanted in a case. When you call 903-763-CASH, your information to Crime Stoppers is confidential and you can remain anonymous. When you give information, you will be assigned a special reference number for your call. You can use this number at a later date to claim a reward if your information leads to an arrest. You need NOT give your name.

Crime Stoppers may pay a reward up to \$1,000 for information on any warrant that leads to an arrest and indictment.

March 16th: Deputy J.W. Williams was dispatched to the 100 block of West oak Street (Yantis High School) in the Yantis area with regard to a report of criminal mischief. The complainant stated that two individuals in a pickup truck went through the double gate at the back of the high school, bending th gate on the right side. While on the property, the subjects entered the baseball field leaving ruts and tearing up the grass, The case is under investigation.

The complainant advised that a subject continues to come to her residence and is not wanted on her property. Stephanie Gilbreath Hass was issued a criminal trespass warning.

with regard to a burglary. The complainant advised that unknown suspect(s) had entered an unlocked door and stolen a 5 x 8 welding trailer with a Miller Bobcat welder/generator valued at \$3,100. The case is under investigation.

March 5th: Deputy Chris Bettis was dispatched to the 1100 block of CR 2260 in the Mineola area with regard to a subject who has a criminal trespass warning on him for this location. Justin Wayne Roberts was placed under arrest for criminal trespass.
